1. Have More of a Hunger for God

5. Learn How to Rely More on God for Strength and Endurance

"I can do all this through him who gives me strength" (Philippians 4:13).

There you will see Him; behold, I have told you."

Over the past two years, the entire world experienced an overload of death. Every family, every church, every job, everywhere all over the world has been largely impacted by the loss of loved ones due to the virus, violence, and its aftermath. Households are devastated and children are orphaned. One thing that has been completely reiterated and forced upon us is death. And death, as we know it, is final.

Nothing comes back from death. Its finality is fact. Something, or someone, has now come to an end. Those connections are gone forever. Those who remain are left without. This is the outlook we have on death. I recall at my uncle's funeral my cousin mentioning... "He's gone. Who's going to walk me down the aisle now?" I struggled with this statement because in my cousin's grief, she missed what was still alive.

Yes. It may sound insensitive, but I truly believe we misunderstand death. Though death is final, it is also needed for the continuation of life. Nothing can live unless something dies. It is the lifecycle of the world. It's how plants grow. How we eat. How we make and wear clothes. Really, death is a necessity for us to completely enjoy the comforts we do. So, why are we so distraught at death? I believe we lose focus of the work before us. We forget this lifecycle that we live in requires us, and everyone and everything around us, to die off to bring a refreshing to the earth and the lives of others. Does it hurt? Yes. Is it hard? Absolutely. Is it necessary? Definitely.

Unfortunately, just like the disciples, the church is guilty of the belief that when someone dies, their work dies with them. And that is not a fact. The work that Jesus did in the lives of people at that time left an indelible mark on their lives. They scattered and left because they believed their work had come to an end, since it aligned to Jesus' life. However, Jesus had to die. That is fact. Why? Because the ministry of Kingdom building needed a refreshing. A revamping to make it new, not only in the hearts of the disciples, but for all the generations of disciples to follow.

Jesus' death and resurrection spread the gospel to places the disciples never had to walk to. How powerful is that? Imagine, would we have ever received Jesus if he had to walk and touch each one of us? That's a big fat "no." Jesus' death proved to all who He was and why He was. And gave the disciples confidence in God's word.

Maybe at funerals, we should change the narrative, from what we miss, to what work does our loved one want us to continue doing. Then again, maybe we should ask ourselves, what needs to die in our lives for us to live in the newness of God's kingdom? I am assured the answer will begin with the story of Jesus and when the Angel of the Lord declared that "He is not here."



At check-in at MPBC, from your mobile device, scan QR Code or tap QR Code (below the inperson registration form) to fill out mandatory COVID Liability Release Form.






