Greetings Mount Pleasant Family,

In the Book of John, Chapter 15, Jesus provides a metaphor and compares Himself to a vine and God as the vinedresser (one who cultivates, prunes, or care for the vineyard). Jesus says He is the vine and that we, believers, are the branches of the vine. He says without being connected to the vine (Jesus), we cannot do anything without Him—we will not take root to be nourished, we will not survive and we will not flourish to bear any fruit.

Are You Rooted?

⁹As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love. ¹⁰ If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love. – **John 15: 9-10 NKJV**

Images from Hurricane Ian that pummeled Florida the last week in September display the devastation of a natural storm. Houses are flattened. Roads are flooded. And that is just the initial contact. People hunkered down while bracing the impact of 100 plus mile winds with little to nothing they could do. Life is like that sometimes. We are all, at times, placed in situations that will enact inevitable damage. These situations may arise suddenly, catching us unprepared. Or they may happen gradually over time. Some storms may come regularly, we just don't know from what direction or what the impact will be. We may even be hit with multiple storms before we can recover from the first one! However they come, whenever they come, the storms in our lives bring damage. How will we ever survive!?!

To survive, we must be rooted like trees. Trees, you say?! Yes. As we see, images of the hurricane's destruction, what is the one consistent thing? Trees! In every picture, every roadway, and near every house, there are trees still standing nearby. They endured the wind and rain and flooding, without any protection, yet they are still left standing. Why?

Trees, especially ones by the coastline, tend to have longer and stronger roots than the average tree. Why you say? While they may have access to the water easily, they cannot anchor in the mud. Ergo, their roots must go past the water table to anchor and not be swept away. They would never grow up if that's the case. Consider this... when trees have been overturned in the storm...the roots are exposed and above ground. A tree whose roots are no longer anchored will "uproot" and die in a storm. Yet, one that is firmly anchored will only give way to the storm... bend... may even lose a few dead limbs, but it will not be uprooted.

A tree that is uprooted is no good. It can no longer grow. But a tree that is broken, can still grow. So, what does this mean for us as we abide in Christ? Simply stated... not only are we anchored in Christ, but we are also anchored in God's creation. We have gone past the limitations of physical and mental alignment to secure our spiritual roots that will not allow the cares of this world to rip up and destroy. It would take extreme effort to evacuate these spiritual roots. And even then, it won't be destroyed.


Nothing can grow without roots. Essentially, once something has roots, it has staying power. It can be snipped and replanted. It can even grow more roots on top of the roots it already has! It can connect to roots of other trees to be sustained even more. And we, much like trees, must be aligned to Jesus such that we follow and be rooted in HIS words and His commands. God not only gives us the Bible, but nature itself speaks God's Word to us. A living and breathing example of what it means to be fully committed to Christ...an abiding so strong that we are rooted in it.


