Deaconess Ministry

The Deaconess Ministry continues to be fully engaged with the members of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church remotely and virtually. They are still serving MPBC during the pandemic by performing their normal duties that include checking on the congregation via telephone calls, sending cards, emails and texts. The Deaconess Ministry continues to encourage their CCM members to get the COVID-19 vaccine.

They are staying active in the church body by attending Sunday Worship Services (virtually and inperson), Church School, Bible Study and Prayer Call/Meetings.

On Saturday, June 11, 2022, the Deaconess Ministry hosted an in-person event for youth (see pictures below). The event was a huge success. Thirty-three people, of which 11 were youth, attended. The facilitator for the event was Dr. Yalonda N. Smith, a licensed counselor. She gave an excellent presentation titled, 'The Pandemic, Youth Mental Health and the Church'. A question was asked, 'The challenges of youth experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic, how can the church help them?' This was Dr. Smith's response: "The church can help by getting training in Youth Mental Health First Aid or other programs to increase their knowledge, awareness and skills to identify youth who may be in distress. It's also important to form partnerships with mental health professionals in your community so you can refer youth and their families".

On Friday and Saturday, July 15 and July 16, 2022, the Deaconess Ministry assisted the Emergency Preparedness Committee with the packing and distribution of food for the MPBC Food Drive.

The Deaconess Ministry asks that you continue to pray for them as they continue to serve you.





Shout Now

¹Everyone, clap your hands. Shout with joy to God! ... ⁹The leaders of the nations have come together with the people of the God of Abraham. All the rulers of the world belong to God. He is over them all! – **Psalm 47: 1; 9 ERV**

Lyrics from the 1971 hit "Inner City Blues" by Marvin Gaye states the following:

Rockets, moon shots; Spend it on the have-not's; Money, we make it; Before we see it, you take it. Oh, make me wanna holler; The way they do my life; Make me wanna holler; The way they do my life; This ain't living, this ain't living; No, no baby, this ain't living; No, no, no, no.

Throughout the entire song, each verse gives a short synopsis on the trials of Black people in the late 60's following with "*Make me wanna holler*." Each holler represents the pain and agony he feels with the state of his people and the world at that time. And 50 years ago, Marvin Gaye spoke about poverty, war, inflation, police brutality, increasing prices and the government sending money overseas for war. Sounds familiar?

Solomon says in Ecclesiastes 1:9 (NLT), "History merely repeats itself. It has all been done before. Nothing under the sun is truly new." And as it was 50 years ago, so it is today. We consistently struggle with the powers and principalities and rulers of this world. We still struggle with wars and rumors of wars. We still struggle with poverty and police brutality. We still struggle with inflation, rising prices and the uncertainty of employment. Nothing is new. My struggles, my parent's struggles and their parents' struggles haven't changed. People live and die, but the earth (and its issues) never seem to change.

Yet here we have in Psalm 47, a different holler. It's not one of defeat and anguish. Rather, it's one of triumph. It's a shout of victory. It's the jovial noise of happiness before a God who has provided. And as you read the rest of Psalm 47, you find that God has defeated the enemy. God has given His people land. God sits on the throne. Everyone is now subject to God's rule. But isn't that the case now? And if so, why are we subject to the daily atrocities that Marvin Gaye spoke about 50 years ago today?

Psalm 47 is both historical and prophetic. It tells of what God has already done while simultaneously mentioning what he is going to do. God reigns perpetually. Ergo, everything and everyone is subject to His rule. We don't recognize it, but He displays His power in every generation. He shuts down the entire world for two and a half years by a simple microorganism. And look at what He did with just 12 disciples. Imagine what God can do with you right now.

God truly is awesome! There's no need to wait for Him to put His power on display. He has already overcome the world. The victory is already yours. Shout Now!




